Rationale

As part of the mandate of the International Poverty Reduction Centre in China (IPRCC), the center is responsible for developing an electronic information sharing platform and strengthening South-South knowledge sharing.

The portal builds on the ADB poverty network established and maintained by ADB from 2009 to 2013 with 18 institutions in Asia.

Co-financed by the World Bank and the Asian Development Bank, IPRCC and the China Development Gateway (CnDG) have developed a new portal –not only a website-on poverty reduction and inclusive growth.

ADB has served as liaison between IPRCC and over 37 institutions located in Asia, the Americas (North, Central and South), Europe and Africa to establish a network of partners for the management and maintenance of the portal.


