A portal – not just a website

Co-financed by the World Bank and the Asian Development Bank, IPRCC and the China Development Gateway (CnDG) have developed a new portal –not only a website– on poverty reduction and inclusive growth.

ADB has served as liaison between IPRCC and over 37 institutions located in Asia, the Americas (North, Central and South), Europe and Africa to establish a network of partners for the management and maintenance of the portal.

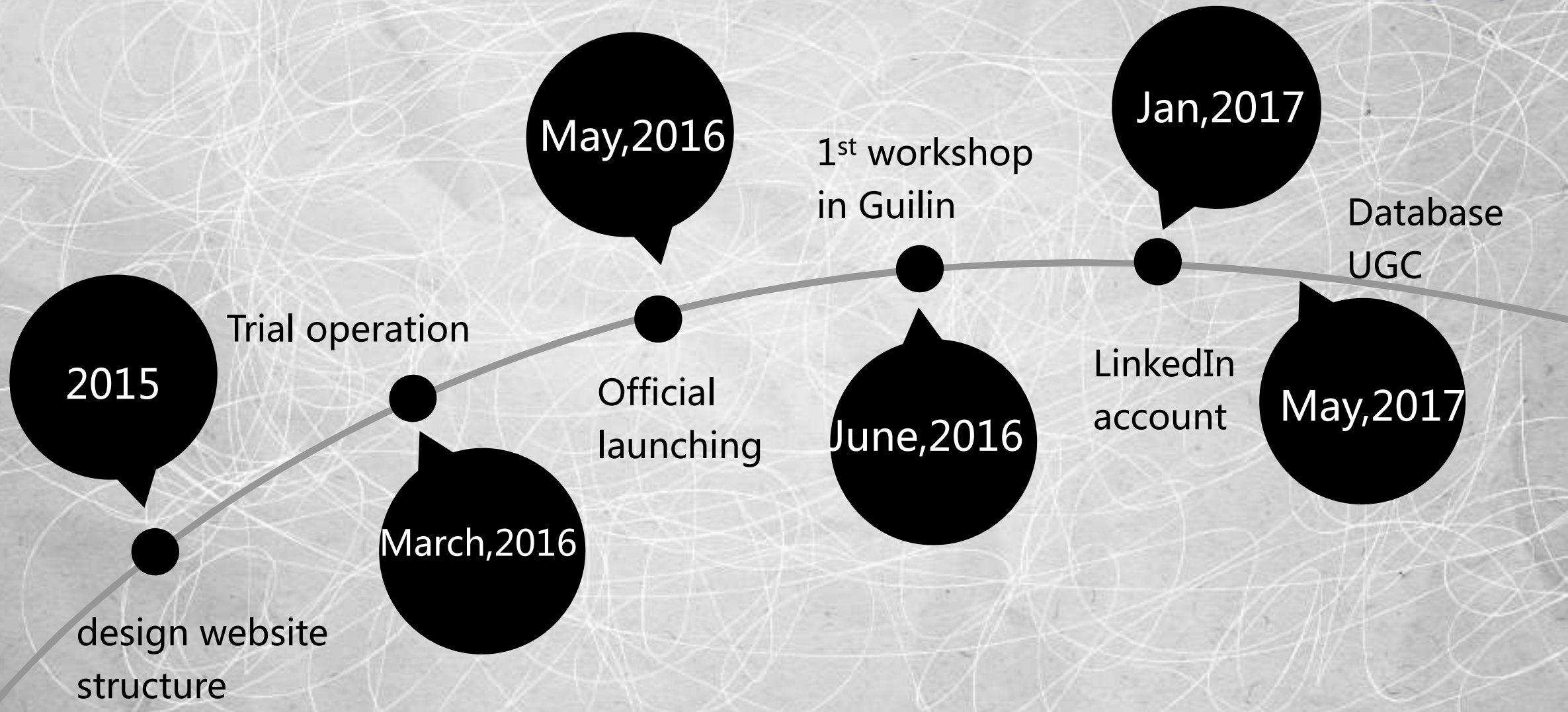

It applies tree diagrams to showcase specific examples of how China has reduced poverty.

Currently we have uploaded 20 case studies from China in both English and Chinese, 22 cases studies from other countries and 8 case studies of China-Africa international cooperation projects.

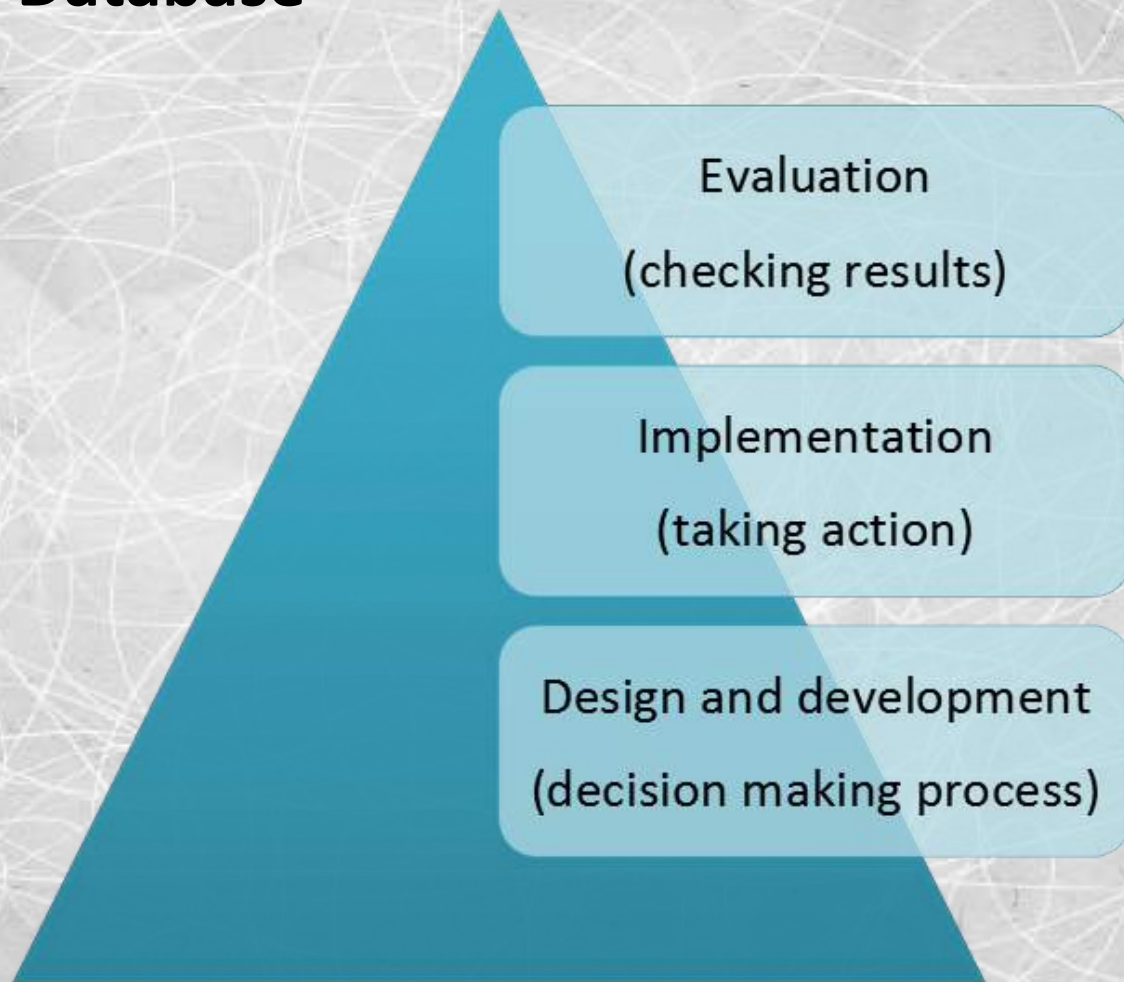

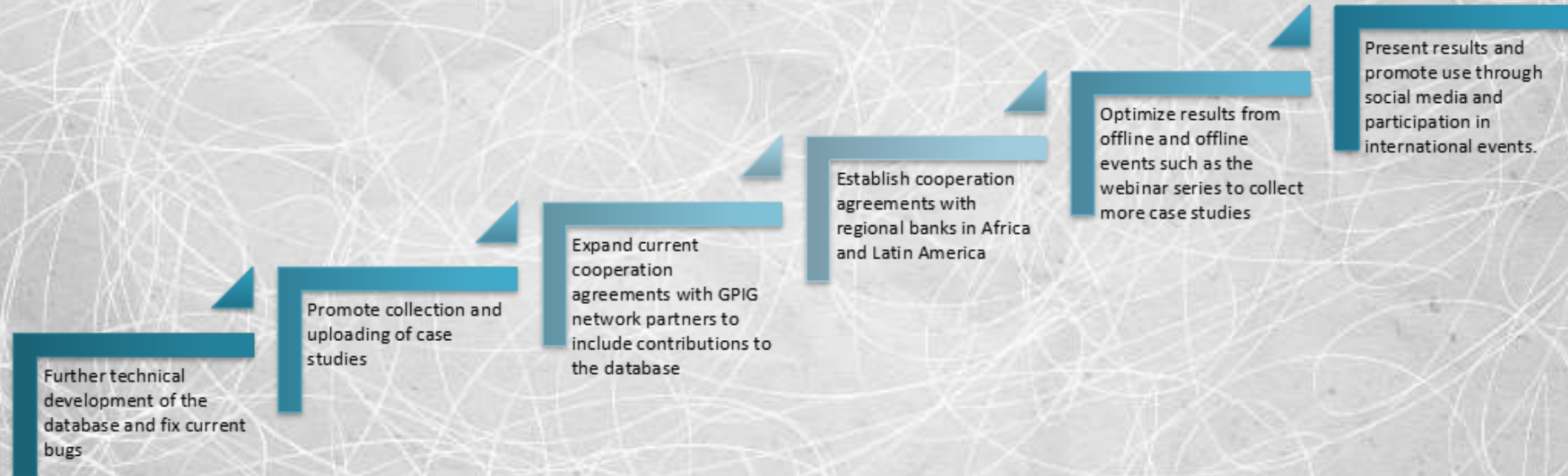
