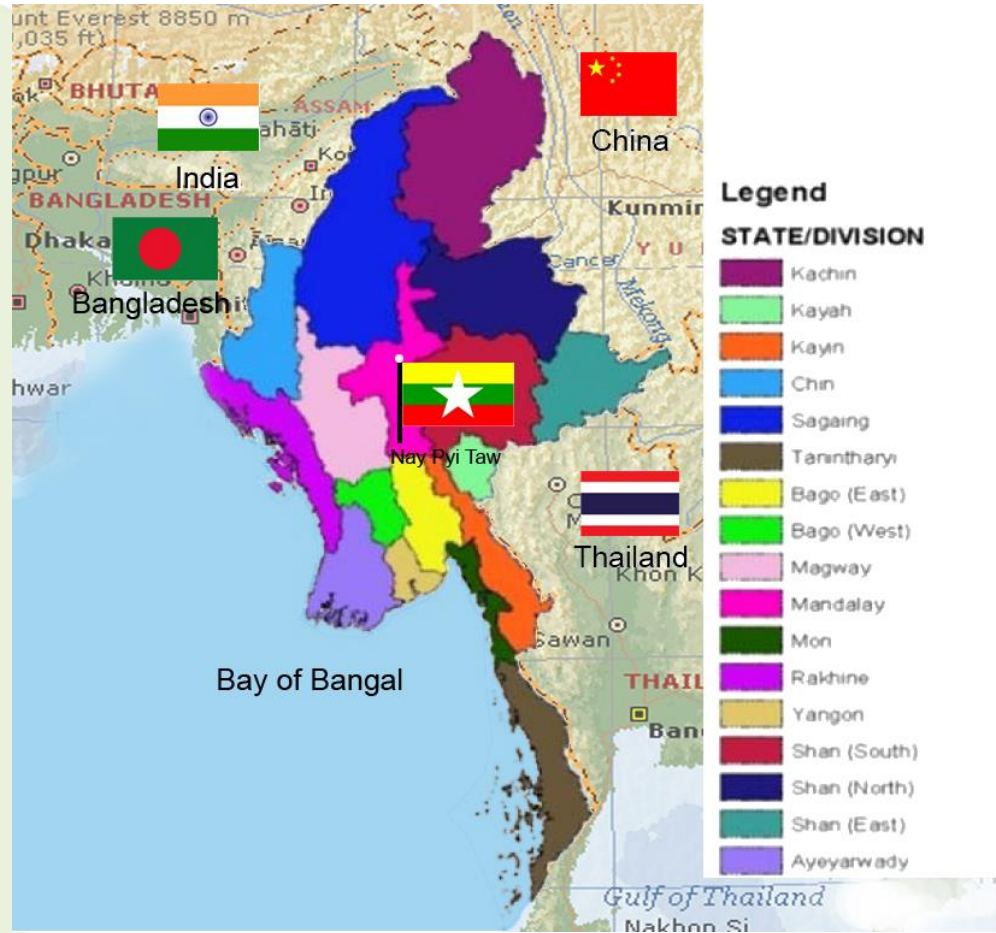

National community Driven Development Project

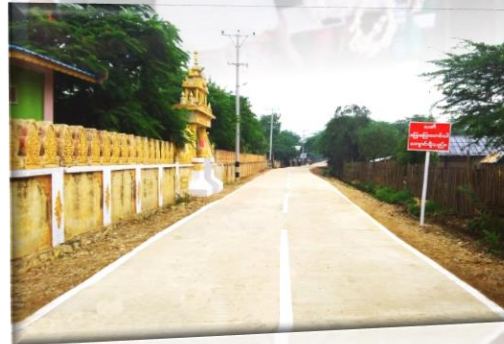


- financing –with IDA grant (\$80 million)

Activities of NCDDP



National electrification Project

Implemented by Drd

- with world bank loan \$400 million
- Grid extension and off-grid electrification(SHS,mini power)
- -Ministry of Electricity and Energy , \$310 million
- -Drd , \$90 million
- -chosen areas (up to 10 miles far from NGL)
- -chosen village-no electricity with 10 to 15 years



Village Development Plan

Launched in 2015

- to support the process of people centered participatory VDP
- identification of development priorities
- mobilization of financing
- VDP and AVIP
- aimed at institution bottom-up planning
- has been scaled up to 5300 village
- 29 township of 298 rural township



Ever green revolving fund project

- have income
- agriculture, livestock, vocational work and small trading with home garden
- provide 30 million for chosen village

Criteria for selected village

- Poor village
- Having agriculture and livestock, farming ability
- Rule of law
- willingness of villagers
- household up to 80
