# **SMALLHOLDERS**

WFP has an enormous range of projects and platforms that empower those furthest behind to sustainably access nutritious food.

- In the short term, we enable smallholders to meet their immediate food needs while focusing on future resilience by empowering them to create productive assets.
- By leveraging WFP's large purchasing power for staple foods to provide smallholders with an entry point into formal markets, farmers are incentivized to produce in higher quantity and better quality.
- At every stage, partnerships and capacity strengthening of local and national entities, farmers organizations and community-based organizations are prioritized.




## PURCHASE FOR PROGRESS

Purchase for Progress (P4P) is a long-term commitment by WFP, began as a pilot in 2008 and has since become a core programme in WFP's country portfolios.

- Leveraging WFP's own purchasing power and expertise in food quality and logistics to sustainably promote smallholder agricultural development and access to formal markets.
- Transforming the lives of millions of SHF, especially women, in 27 developing countries.

## RESULTS AND SYSTEMIC IMPACTS



#### Pro-smallholder procurement

366,658 mt was delivered to WFP under SHF-friendly procurement modalities



#### **Gender equality**

Women's participation tripled to 300,000 from 2008 to 2016



#### **Nutrition**

Support SHFs to produce nutritious foods to prevent malnutrition



#### Farmers' organizations

Over 1,000 FOs, covering 1.7 million SHFs from 2008 to 2014



#### Government ownership

Governments play as a key role in a variety of ways



#### Food quality and safety

Defaults decreased from 5% to 0.5% from 2010 to 2014



#### **Partnership**

Over 500 partners were recorded, including 35 country level partnership agreements



#### Financial Inclusion

Provide farmers and FOs with better access to finance



#### **Transforming WFP**

Reviewed and enhanced its ways of working in procurement, food safety, staffing, ...



#### Infrastructure improvement

Support agricultural infrastructure

The Government committed to purchasing from smallholder FOs under the government-owned Common P4P






#### **Afghanistan**
