The first webinar today will focus on sharing the PRC's integrated approach to agricultural infrastructure development.

The PRC's success in agriculture productivity and reform is driven by strong investments in agriculture infrastructure together with bold institutional innovations linking small scale producers to markets. With increasing pressures on natural resouces and environmental degredation, the PRC has successfully shifted its policy focus over the last decade from purely boosting food production to a more integrated and balanced approach to transform agriculture into more sustainable and climate resilient sector. Private sector invesetment in agriculture and food supply chains is increasingly playing an increasingly important role in the sustainable and resilient transformation of agriculture sector.

The PRC and ADB have been supporting a more integrated model of agricultural infrastructure investment projects that increase food security, boost agricultural productivity and improve sustainability and climate resilience with a strong focus on institutional strengthening and capacity building.

Countries in Asia and the Pacific face common challenges of achieving food security through developing more productive, sustainable and resilient agricultural approaches. Today's webinar provides an opportunity to learn lessons from the integrated approach to agriculture infrastructure investment in the PRC. Capturing and sharing this knowledge is extremely valuable – not only for ADB's developing member countries but also for global community. ADB will continue its efforts to share the development experience of the PRC with other member countries through various platforms such as RKSI, CAREC and GMS.

I am delighted to welcome our colleagues from government agencies, academia, civil society and the private sector along with our colleagues from other ADB regional departments to share experiences, discuss challenges and propose potential solutions for future investment strategies to achieve sustainable and resilient agriculture and food system across Asia and the Pacific.
