



INTRODUCTION

- Guangxi ranks among the top three in foreign trade among western regions
- Border trade accounts for over 20% of Guangxi's total foreign trade volume
- Three cities of Guangxi border with Vietnam with CNY84.7 billion GDP in 2021
- Unbalanced development and policy interventions
- Readiness and necessity to improve tourism facilities, marketing strategies and resource development
- Multiple ethnic minorities with complicated geographic and topographic conditions
- Total of 102 A-class tourism sites, 71 registered travel agencies and 88 star-level hotels







THE PROGRAM

- Outcome: A TVET system that provides graduates with better employment opportunities in GZAR's industries established
- Key outputs: Industry relevance of TVET enhanced; quality of TVET improved; inclusiveness of TVET increased; role of TVET in regional economic development expanded
- **Key activity types:** industry partnerships, quality improvement, infrastructure development, increase of technical teachers with industry experience, poverty alleviation, ethnic culture inheritance and innovation, and regional cooperation with ASEAN countries
- Program expenditure: \$10.02 billion (2017–2020)
- Main financiers and the respective financing amounts: ADB: \$250 million; KfW: \$200 million equivalent (in euros); government: \$6,833 million; public TVET institutions: \$1,801 million; commercial banks: \$938 million
- Geographic coverage: GZAR (public TVET institutions only; excluding activities categorized A under ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement [2009])



REGIONAL COOPERATION AND INTEGRATION

Between TVET institutions and enterprises in GZAR and ASEAN countries:

- Promoting partnership agreements for long-term cooperation
- Increasing the number of participants in partnership training and other cross-border training programs
- Increasing the number of students from ASEAN countries who receive vocational education certificates from TVET institutions in GZAR






COOPERATIVE EDUCATION

- Established of the "China-ASEAN Tourism Education Alliance" together with China-ASEAN Center and 18 tourism colleges and enterprises from China and ASEAN countries
- Organized more than 30 training programs for ASEAN tourism talents and cultivated over 3,000 mid- to high-level tourism management professionals in the ASEAN region, among which four sessions of advanced tourism management training courses for the Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) and three sessions of high-level tourism management training courses for ASEAN were organized under the ADB program
- Established the ASEAN Tourism Research Center with the China Tourism Academy and published two volumes of the "ASEAN Tourism Blue Book"
